

## Pattern for Flower Pin

Finished Size: Approx. 3" x 5"

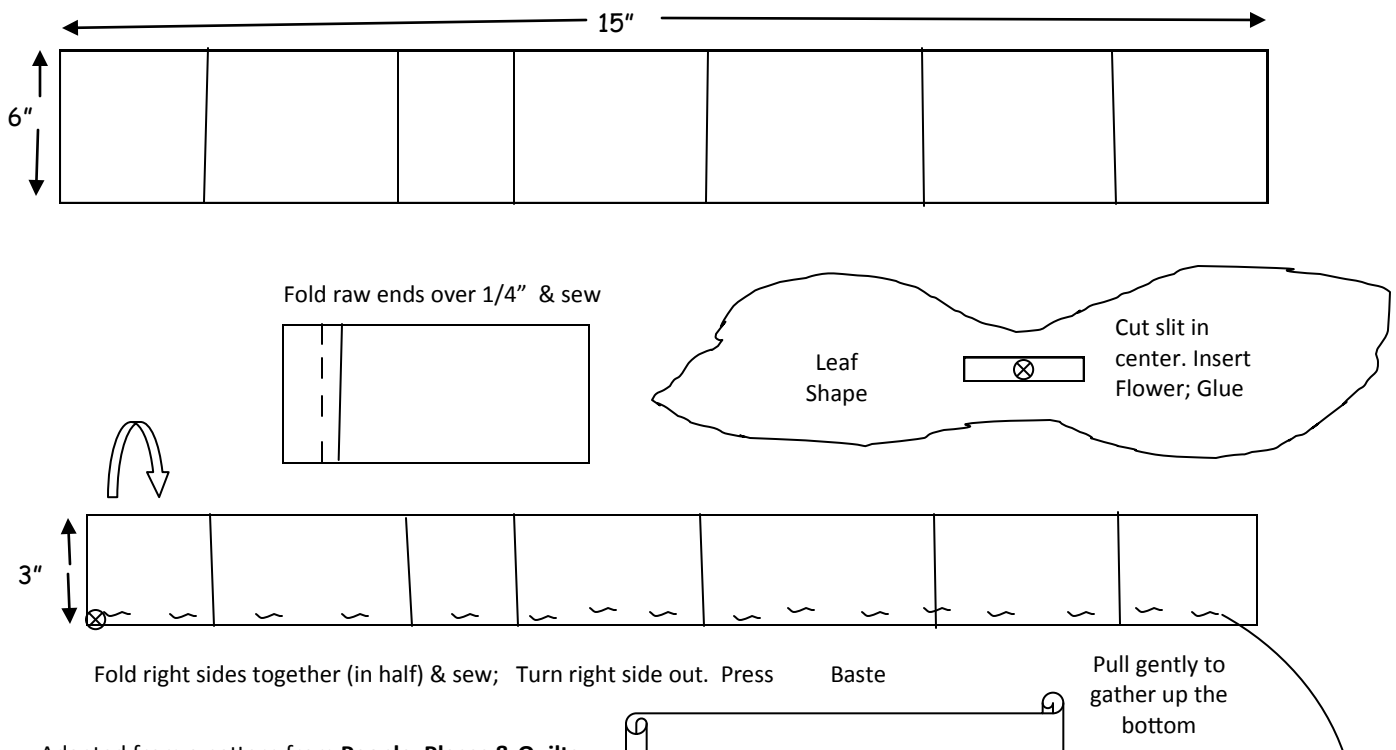
Supplies: 7 Scraps of fabric- 6" long x various widths to total approx. 16"

Matching thread, sewing machine, iron, pinking scissors

Stiff Green Felt; self stick 1-1/2" Pin Back, Hot Glue Gun

Directions:

- Place scraps side by side to make a pleasing row of scraps approximately 16" long.
- Sew all pieces together with a 1/4" seam
- Turn under each short raw edge to give a finished edge and sew with matching thread
- Fold right sides together, in half lengthwise, to make approx. 3" x 15" piece
- Sew a 1/4" seam along the raw edges
- Turn, press
- With matching thread, sew a long basting stitch on the sewn long side. You can use button thread or quilting thread for a stronger gathering stitch
- Gather the stitches pulling gently to form bottom of flower; roll one end toward the center; wrap around & stitch the bottom to hold the gathered area
- Cut a leaf shape with pinking shears; cut slit in center; hot glue flower into the leaf slit
- Cover back with 2nd leaf shape; Hot glue the pin back to the back of the leaf
