From the President

I have just had the most wonderful time. For the past few days, I have been in quilt heaven. I attended the American Quilt Study Group's Seminar held in Cherry Hill, New Jersey. For three days, I was immersed in the study of antique quilts with a group whose depth of knowledge is amazing.

There was a selection of quilts from the Christ Collection on display. The center piece of the presentation was a Baltimore Album Quilt. The range of patterns in the other quilts included a red work quilt of the nativity to a charming alphabet quilt. Each quilt in the display was in pristine condition and exhibited hand quilting that showed the true artistry of the maker. On one of the days, we took a road trip to the Burlington Historical Society and the Trenton Museum. I saw my first "quilt turning" at Burlington. The discussions by group members as to age, pattern, etc. added to the history of each quilt. There was also a display of album quilts that showed what I think of as traditional appliqué and broderie perse including one of the more exquisite quilts I have ever seen.

At Trenton, we viewed their large collection of signature quilts. Quite a few of the quilts were from Ocean and Monmouth Counties. We also learned about some of the features of New Jersey style quilts. In the course of the discussions at both places, there were those quilts whose history and provenance were unknown because the quilt maker did not sign her work. I am sure that most of the makers did not consider the future life span of her work. Yet, here we were 100 years later trying to glean information from the fabric of the quilt.

We all have those quilts that are still unlabeled. No matter how small or insignificant our projects may be, we owe it to ourselves and the future of quilts to label our quilts with at the very least our name, date, and place made. Who knows? Perhaps some quilt anthropologist of the future may come across our quilts and be able to complete her thesis on quilts of the twenty first century.

Results from the 24 members who responded to the President's Questionnaire handed out at the June 2011 meeting:

Almost all responded that they joined the guild to meet other quilters, learn new techniques, improve skills, and actively participate in guild projects. The majority of respondents come to meetings to socialize and learn. The majority are willing to be involved the same amount of time as previously. The majority agreed that for charity quilts providing patterns, kits, and information about organizations that receive quilts is important. September Meeting Minutes:

President Ellen Hyers welcomed the members. Bylaws were reviewed and additions regarding the communications chair and impeachment procedure were discussed. Bylaws were successfully voted in after a first by Linda Felton and a second by Pat Toscan and passed unanimously by voice vote.

Passports were handed out. Those with best attendance will be eligible for prizes worth \$100, \$50 and \$25. Anyone making charity projects can use as credit for a missed meeting.

We should put on a special charity quilt drive - Hugs from the Heart, suggested by Ellen. The triumvirate of Ellen, Marlene Stoever and Ruth Felipe will chair the charity project. One suggestion was dresses for Africa, with the instructions to go on the website. Anyone with other suggestions, e.g. helmet liners, preemie blankets, let one of the committee know.

Judy Richtmyer said that everyone should already be assigned to a basket committee for the quilt show auctions. Please, no more garden themes.

Ellen passed out the photo albums from the beginning years. Everyone was encouraged to look through them & enjoy the beginnings of the Guild.

Genny V. discussed the programs for the coming year, stressing fairness, so everyone should find something they like. Peggy Oppenheimer will present our October 22 program on the square in a square precision piecing technique, and a workshop on the 23rd at the Berkeley Branch of the Ocean County Library. November 18 will be Cheryl Lynch, who has won numerous awards and appeared on HGTV with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. The topic will be South of the Border, with a workshop on November 19.

For January, Marsha and Marlene will show us how to make ornaments for the country store, followed by 5 games of Quilto. February, Laurie and Debbie will demonstrate/ teach other country store items. In March Jean Campbell will discuss color, scale and values in Bargello quilts. If the members are interested, we can have her for a workshop next year.

On March 19th we will have a sashiko workshop at the Toms River Library. In May, Trish Hodge, who studied in Indonesia, will give a lecture on Friday the 18th and a workshop on Saturday the 19th about copper stamping and batik.

We will be looking for different locations to find places for workshops. Anyone with ideas, contact Ellen or Genny.

Jeannette Middlekauff and Dona Spencer have a variety of sizes of blocks planned for BOM this coming year. Most are 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, but there is also a 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, a 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and a 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch block.

Linda Felton, Treasurer, reported a beginning balance of \$8,455.38 plus receipts of \$725.00 less disbursements of \$1,211.65 for an ending balance of \$7,968.73.

Pat Toscan announced other quilt shows around the area. And the Hayloft is closing, much to the dismay of the members.

Genny still has T shirts, tote bags and sweatshirts for sale until October. Get your orders in soon.

Door prizes were won by Sue Ambrosino, Carol Beggans, Debbie Perks and Helen Lemke.

Laurie thanked all those who volunteered for the quilt show. Get your quilts finished soon, as the registration will begin in February.

Quilt Show News: From the Country Store Chair, Debbie Perks

Laurie and Debbie had a meeting on 10-6-11 to discuss The Country Store as it relates to our show and planning for the February 2012 meeting of the guild. Lots of patterns and ideas were shared and a few will be made into pattern sheets for distribution at the January meeting to those interested. These patterns can be started at home and finished at the Feb. meeting. If interested, members can bring their own projects to work on at the Feb. meeting.

Debbie would like to solicit more folded fat quarters for donation to the Country Store. Buttons of all kinds, fabric odds and ends, and decent, clean, slightly used patterns or unopened notions are needed for this endeavor. Magazines should be bundled in sets of 3 or 5 recent issues for sale.

Newly crafted or sewn items can be donated as well: pin cushions, pot holders, wallets, change purses, needle cases, goody bags, lunch bags, totes, aprons, placemats, or whatever your imagination dictates. Please donate at least 1 item as well as stash treasures you no longer need.

Any projects that have been started with the original directions and fabric kit materials would make a fine addition to the store. An unused quilt kit with all the fixings could find a new home if you choose to donate.

The Country Store will once again sell your quilt with a 10 % commission fee given to the guild. Story cards must indicate that the quilt is for sale through the store.

Debbie has been kind enough to give up her house for storage of these items as soon as they are brought into meetings. Sounds like an easy "win-win situation" for all of us, but please help her by organizing and labeling items first.

Remember, if the used stash item doesn't sell, we need you to reclaim it, or toss it. All new crafted items that don't sell will be used for the Luncheon as door prizes.
