The meeting was held in Fellowship Hall of the church. We were reminded to assist the church by cleaning our tables before we leave.

The food pantry is in need of donations, particularly protein like peanut butter and tuna.

The food pantry serves 29 sites around the county and is non-profit and non-denominational. So far this year, they have provided needy families with over 2200 bags of food.

Marlene will put our charity projects on the website.

Barbara Schioppa announced that the Ocean County Historical Society will be having their annual quilt show on November 4 through the 6th, from 10:00 to 5:pm. Fran Gillesheimer will have a special exhibit of 32 of her quilts.

Trish Hodge will give a workshop on May 19 on batik and copper stamping.

Block of the month was won by Shirley M. Door prizes won by Shirley, Kate T., Barbara S., Pat L., Mary Lou G.

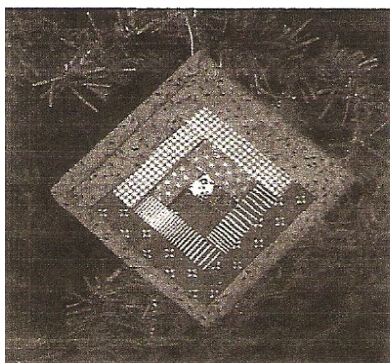
The evenings program was given by Peggy Oppenheimer with many lovely quilts done with the special square in a square ruler.

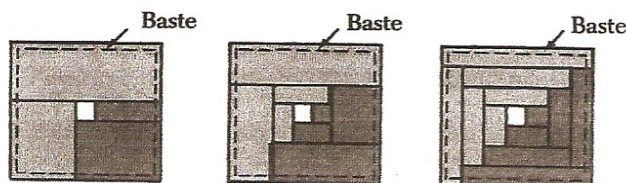
FINISHED SIZE: 4" x 4"

MATERIALS

4" x 4" square: 1 muslin for foundation
 4" x 4" square: 1 light background
 3½" x 4" strips: 2 red print #1, 2 green print #1
 2½" x 4" strips: 2 red print #2, 2 green print #2
 1½" x 4" strips: 2 red print #3, 2 green print #3
 4" x 4" square: 1 for backing
 Finishing material (see pages 7-9)

DIRECTIONS

1. Secure light background fabric to foundation.
2. Fold 3½" x 4" strips in half lengthwise; press. Place around outside edge of foundation, having fold toward center and raw edges along the outside. Place green strips on 2 adjacent sides of block and red strips on remaining sides. Secure around outside edge.
3. Fold 2½" x 4" strips in half; press. Repeat placement given in Step 2; secure.
4. Fold 1½" x 4" strips in half; press. Repeat placement given in Step 2; secure.

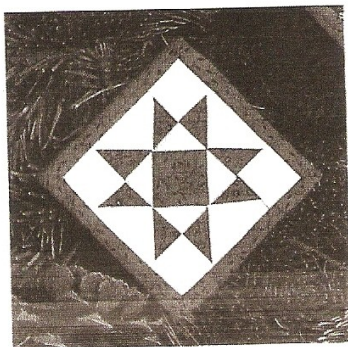

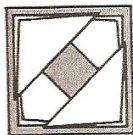
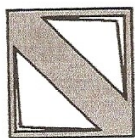
FINISHED SIZE: $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

MATERIALS

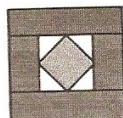
$3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square: 1 muslin for foundation
 $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square: 1 red for star center
 $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " squares: 4 white for Row 1
 2 " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips: 4 green for Row 2
 2 " x 2 " squares: 4 white for Row 3
 3 " x 3 " squares: 4 white for Row 4
 $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square: 1 for backing
 Finishing material (see pages 7-9)

DIRECTIONS

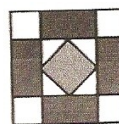
1. Secure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " red square for star center to foundation.
2. Fold $2\frac{3}{4}$ " white squares for Row 1 in half diagonally; press. Position one in each corner of foundation, having fold toward center and raw edges along outside. Secure along outside edges.



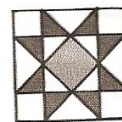
3. Fold green strips for Row 2 in half lengthwise; press. Position one on each side, having fold toward center and raw edges along outside; secure. Using green thread, tack through all layers at points of red center diamond.



4. Fold 2 " white squares for Row 3 in quarters; press. Position one in each corner, having raw edges even; secure.



5. Fold 3 " white squares for Row 4 in quarters; press. Position one on each side, aligning point of square with center diamond; secure. Trim away excess.



6. Using white thread, tack all points of white squares through all layers.
7. Add backing, then use the technique you prefer to finish raw edges (see pages 7-9).

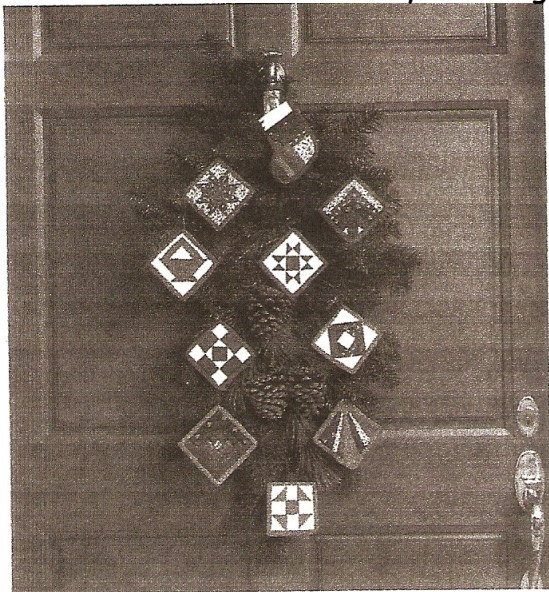

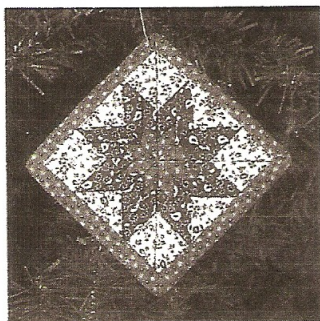

FINISHED SIZE: $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$

MATERIALS

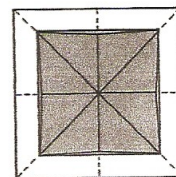
$3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ square: 1 muslin for foundation
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ squares: 5 red for Row 1
 $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares: 8 green for Row 2
 $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares: 8 white for Row 3
 $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ square: 1 for backing
 Finishing material (see pages 7-9)

DIRECTIONS

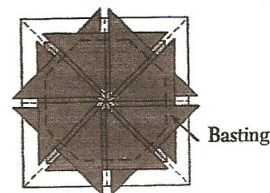
1. Reserve one of the red $2\frac{1}{2}''$ squares to be used as the star's center. Press all remaining squares as illustrated.



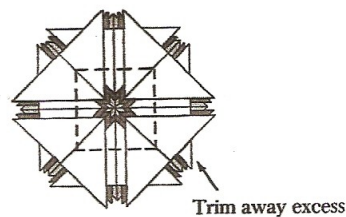
2. Place unpressed $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square in center of $3\frac{1}{2}''$ muslin square. You may wish to secure this with fusible webbing. Position the pressed $2\frac{1}{2}''$ squares as illustrated to form star's center.



3. Tack these points tightly in place at the star's center. Secure around the outside edges.
4. For the second row of the folded radiant star, place pressed squares as indicated in diagram. They should be $\frac{3}{8}''$ from center of fold in the first row. Tack center points in place through all thicknesses. Hand or machine baste around edges to hold in place.



5. Continue in same manner for Row 3. Using foundation fabric as a guide, trim away excess fabric.



6. Add backing, then use the technique you prefer to finish raw edges (see pages 7-9).

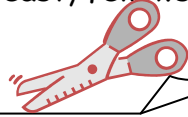

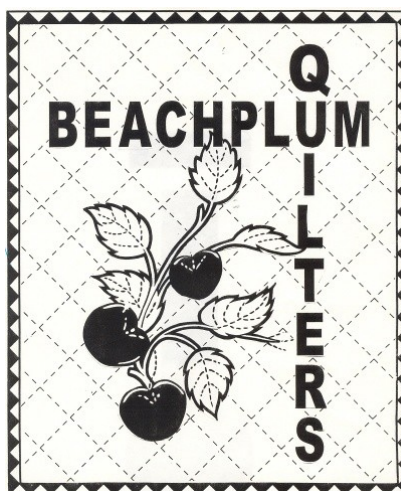
