

Ellen thanked those who showed up for the charity quilt workshop this month. All fabrics are now in kits which include all the fabric needed to complete the quilt (backing and binding) except for batting and patterns. Please take a kit. You will receive an extra sticker in your passport if you complete one. Charity quilts were shown by Jackie P., Ruth S., Laurie S., and Ellen H. (with a matching pillowcase).

Show and tell was wonderful, as usual, showcasing the numerous talents of our members.

One quilt was for the Wounded Warrior project. The quilts are put on the stretchers of wounded servicemen. The project is in need of 48 X 78 tops with 60X 90 backing, no batting. They will be sent to long armers who finish them for the soldiers.


