

Minutes of October 21, 2022 Meeting

President Donna D. welcomed everyone to the meeting at 6:33 pm.

She asked for a moment of silence in memory of Shirley M.

Donna said she wanted to move quickly through old business so we can get to our Speaker, Eleanor Levie, by approximately 7 pm.

There were no guests present but we had several new members in attendance and they were welcomed.

October Birthdays: Susan A., Cathy M.

Donna asked if there were any errors or omissions to the minutes of the September meeting as published in our newsletter? Hearing none she asked for a motion to approve the minutes as published. Motion made by Richard L. and seconded by Dona S. Motion Carried

Erma H. read the treasurer's report. The ending balance was 19,093.41. A motion was made by Jane S. to approve the treasurer's report and seconded by Debbie P. Motion carried.

President Donna D. said the minutes read were correct as read, but she need to update the Island Beach State Park final tally. It wasn't \$625.00 it was \$670.00

She asked all who renewed their membership before September to see Ginger C to sign their renewal forms.

Donna said the Guild received another "Can you make me a quilt" request from the Web Site. It would contain pieces of an Cotton Eyelet Wedding Dress, be approximately 50x60, Bear's Paw Block Pattern, and due by September 2023. There were no volunteers for the project at this time.

Donna read a Thank You note from Downey Side Adoptions Services for quilts we donated to them.

Gloria S., Luncheon Chair, Saturday, April 22, 2023 was unable to attend the meeting. Donna read the report Gloria had prepared regarding venues she had contacted: Captain's Inn, Cathy's Italian Restaurant, Clarion Hotel and Artisans. After hearing the pros and cons of each venue, the membership majority voted by a show of hands to select The Captain's Inn as the luncheon site.

Donna announced that Dixie M. has stepped up to chair the challenge quilt portion of the luncheon. Dixie shared the challenge theme and rules. Everyone had received an envelope and inside were the printed rules for the challenge: "Create a quilt inspired by a favorite piece of art". The size can be from 12" x18" to 24" x 36", and those measurements can be converted to square inches if your inspiration piece would dictate a longer, narrower quilt or an unusual shape. Your quilt should be inspired, not a copy.

Donna asked for any Volunteers to be our next Quilt Show Chairman (or Co-chairs)? There was no one at this time.

• **Programs:** Dina N., Program Chair, announced that the November "Make and Take" requirements would be sent to everyone in an email by November 1. Those without email would get a postal mailed copy.

Dina spoke of her September trip to Davenport for the Quilt Judge 4-day seminar and told of the over 400 quilts that were judged.

Dina introduced our guest speaker, Eleanor Levie. Eleanor was going to tell us how to "Rock our Quilts", and make them our own.

Eleanor proceeded with a lively and colorful presentation that gave us "12 Tips to Rock our Quilts" She had examples of created works that demonstrated each of the tips and they were circulated amongst the members for closer inspection. There was even a mini-fashion show with members as models!

Donna D. thanked Eleanor for her great presentation and all the good tips.

Dina N. drew the winning tickets for the winter placemat donations. Ginger C. and Laurie S. won \$25.00 gift certificates to Crafty Fabrics and Jane S. won a large Vera Bradley tote bag. Dina said last year we donated 194 placemats, she would like for us to top that total this year.

- **Charity Quilts:** (Carol C. and Juanita G.) Juanita read the donation report which included 15 quilts to Downeyside Adoption Agency. Harbor House was contacted and they have a supervised transitional living program for 16-21 year-olds and were receptive to receiving quilts. Juanita reminded everyone that they needed to "sign-in" the quilts they were donating for accurate record keeping.
- **Block of the Month:** (Marcia G/Dixie M/Emilie S) The October "Sticks and Stones" blocks were won by Janet P.
- **Door Prizes** (Jane S.) The winners were 1. Dianne W.; 2. Terry P.; 3. Erma H.

Dina N. mentioned that in regards to the Quilt show, she would be taking on the judging chairmanship. She had previously been vendor chair, and for whomever took that on for the 2024 show, Dina has already filled the spots with return vendors and would be willing to work with the new Chair. Donna D. mentioned she would handle the printed items for the show.

- **Show and Tell** (Marlene S.) Many beautiful quilts were displayed by our members.

Ginger C. spoke up and said she had counted the placemats that were donated earlier in the evening, and there were 95 of them. We are well on our way to breaking last year's record!

President Donna D. adjourned the meeting at 8:35 pm.

Hi Everyone,

What is this winter going to bring us? Well, it depends upon who you want to listen to - I've heard very cold with very little snow, but The Old Farmer's Almanac is predicting a "**shivery and snowy**" 2022-2023 winter season on the East Coast. Either way, we're going to have SNOW much fun at November's Beachplum Quilt Guild Meeting!

The choices for the November craft will be either Soup Can Snowmen or Adorable Glove Snowmen. There are so many wonderful ideas for winter crafts, but I needed to pick something that would not take us that long to make. I will provide 23 gloves and everything else. If you want to make both, we won't have enough time at the meeting, but I'll have some instruction sheets for you to take home. Here's the supply list that I need you to bring, please:

Soup Can Snowman

Clean, empty can, like from vegetables or soup, remove the label

Batting - I probably have enough for everyone, so don't buy any, but if you have any polyester batting scraps, they need to be large enough to wrap around the can.

Any color fabric or wide ribbon to make a scarf

Adorable Glove Snowman

Needle & white thread


Coordinating fabric and 2 buttons for hat, scarf and buttons on the torso (it can be any color you want). You can also use beads on the torso.

Leftover batting to use as stuffing




